### CENTER EXPANDS SCHOOL-BASED SERVICES TO MEIGS, BRADLEY AND MCMINN COUNTIES



he McNabb Center has expanded its school-based services and is now able to serve students in Meigs, McMinn and Bradley counties.

**C** This expansion is exciting because it allows us to provide traumainformed behavioral health services

"Our school-based services aim to foster positive relationships between schools and families as well as remove barriers for students needing care." The Tennessee Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services is working to expand school-based services statewide. The goal is to provide a school-based behavioral health liaison in every county in Tennessee. This expansion will provide necessary support for school aged children who are struggling

## WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AWARD

he McNabb Center was awarded a five-year, nearly \$2.5 million grant to provide supported employment services to individuals seeking treatment for substance use disorder. The grant program, funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), is intended to implement evidence-based programs to support individuals in substance use disorder treatment and recovery to live independently and participate in the workforce.

**66** We know that obtaining employment helps individuals maintain their recovery journey," said Michael Waltke, McNabb Center's senior director of adult outpatient mental health and recovery services. "Through this grant we will be able to support clients in developing job skills and find and keep their job."

This service will be offered to individuals active in the Center's existing intensive outpatient treatment programs. The goal is to help people who have a substance use disorder diagnosis to quickly obtain and maintain employment.

The McNabb Center will hire four employment specialists who will serve Anderson, Blount, Hamblen, Hamilton, Knox, McMinn and Sevier Counties.

## MCNABB CENTER PARTNERS WITH GIRLS, INC. TO PROVIDE SERVICES, BREAK DOWN BARRIERS

he McNabb Center was honored to receive a United Way Impact Grant to provide services benefiting the girls and families of Girls Inc. of Chattanooga.

This funding will diminish barriers surrounding mental health and substance use stigmas and improve access to care by offering social service resources provided through Girls Inc. in school and out of school programs.

We are excited for the opportunity to partner with Girls Inc. of Chattanooga to provide this additional service in the community," said Gayle Lodato, senior director of Greater Chattanooga Area services for McNabb Center. "It is important to break down barriers to care, and through this partnership we will work to end the stigma associated with mental health care."

By way of a Master's degreed employee, this partnership offers a new social service, academic and clinical resource for Girls Inc. participants to enhance the social-emotional support Girls Inc. provides. The program will foster collaboration between schools, academic enrichment and afterschool programs, clinical services and families to ensure positive outcomes for these girls.

The Center will begin on-site visits to build relationships, offer one-on-one and small group counseling, staff check-ins and training, and workshops to connect families with the appropriate resources.

## FIRST CLASSES GRADUATE FROM THERAPEUTIC PRESCHOOL

he Center is now excited to celebrate the graduation of the program's third class of participants! In August of 2020, the McNabb Center was fortunate to open its Therapeutic Preschool program in Chattanooga.

The McNabb Center currently provides the only two Therapeutic Preschools in the state of Tennessee. The Preschool is a 10-week outpatient program for children ages 4-6 who have experienced a traumatic event, such as abuse, neglect, natural disaster or loss of a loved one. Children enrolled in the preschool have special emotional needs that many childcare and school facilities are not equipped to accommodate. The program helps children learn to manage difficult feelings and make safe choices.

The Center has over 30 years of experience providing this level of care in Knoxville and has been successful in being

able to replicate and implement this program in the Greater Chattanooga area.

The preschool is accepting referrals while ensuring CDC social distancing is followed. As a result of the Center's diverse funding sources, children are able to receive services regardless of their family's ability to pay.
